Kathleen Bühler (Chair)

Kathleen Buhler studied art history, film, and philosophy, earning a PhD from the University of Zurich with a dissertation on the experimental film of Carolee Schneemann (Marburg 2009). She has been Curator and Head of the Department of Contemporary Art at the Kunstmuseum Bern since 2008. Before that, she worked as a curator and research associate at the Museum zu Allerheiligen in Schaffhausen, at the Kunstmuseum des Kantons Thurgau Kartause Ittingen, at the Swiss National Museum, at the Flick Collection in Zurich, and as a conservator at the Bündner Kunstmuseum in Chur. From 2002 to 2007, she wrote a number of exhibition reviews for the arts section of the Neue Zürcher Zeitung. She regularly publishes articles on contemporary art for catalogs and newspapers.

Mario Casanova

Mario Casanova is Curator and Director of the Centro d'Arte Contemporanea Ticino in Bellinzona. Since its foundation in 1994, the CAC Ticino has led the way in supporting and promoting contemporary art in Italian-speaking Switzerland. With its excellent international connections, the CAC Ticino remains an artists' archive, center for creation and exchange.

Simon Lamunière

Simon Lamunière is an artist and independent curator, who lives in Geneva. A long-standing lecturer in video art at various universities, he was also head of Art Unlimited at ART Basel from 2000 to 2011, and curated the 11th *Utopics* Swiss sculpture exhibition in Biel in 2009.
